<p>(#) Pre-majors can take JOMC 101/11 or 102/15 as freshmen and other JOMC courses as sophomores, but no more than 12 hours. JOMC 153/53 is required for all sequences and is a suggested first course for students in the News-Editorial sequence. A score of 70% on the School's spelling and grammar examination, given in JOMC 153/53 is still required for graduation. Other appropriate JOMC courses for sophomores: JOMC 180/80, 182/85, 441/111, 342/112, 442/115, 424/124, 130/130, 240/140, 141/141, 242/142, 344/144, 446/146, 448/160, and 170/170, none of which requires JOMC 153/53 as a prerequisite. A grade of D in core JOMC course or a sequence core course may not count toward graduation, and the course must be repeated. A GPA of 2.0 in JOMC courses is required. Only one D grade in a JOMC elective may be counted in the minimum JOMC credit hours required for graduation.</p> <p>(##) Majors must complete at least 28 hours of JOMC courses (excluding JOMC 394/55) and at least 80 hours outside JOMC (including at least 65 in the College of Arts and Sciences).</p> <p>(###) Students are expected to gain a depth of knowledge of a topic outside the school. At a minimum, they must take an outside concentration of at least three courses (minimum of nine credit hours) in another department or school, and courses used to satisfy General College requirements cannot be used to satisfy that requirement. Students may also satisfy the outside requirement by completing a minor or second major in another department or school. Students who wish to complete a second major must submit a second-major declaration form in Carroll 154. They must meet all requirements for the second major (particularly with regard to upper-level perspectives) and must see advisors in the second major.</p> <p>(####) May not use courses in JOMC, cross-listed, or in department of minor or second major.</p>
