## Honors in History

The departmental honors program is open to any qualified History major with at least a 3.3 cumulative grade point average and, under normal circumstances, a 3.4 in History courses, and experience in research and writing derived from an undergraduate seminar in History (HIST 391–397). The student pursuing a degree in History with honors must take HIST 691H and 692H; these two courses contribute credit hours toward fulfilling field-of-concentration requirements, depending on the topic of the thesis. Students should submit applications for the honors program by the end of February during their junior year. For detailed guidelines, contact the director of honors in the Department of History.
