Additional Requirements

Students also must complete all General Education requirements, including STOR 155 (quantitative reasoning Foundations) and ECON 101 (social and behavior sciences Approaches). STOR 155 is a prerequisite for PLCY 460, and ECON 101 is a prerequisite for ECON 310, ECON 410, and PLCY 410. MATH152, 231 or STOR 113 is a prerequisite for ECON 410. PLCY 460 is a prerequisite for PLCY 698 and a pre- or co-requisite for PLCY 681 and PLCY 691H. PLCY 691H is a prerequisite for PLCY 692H.

Program Restrictions

PLCY 320 and 325 may not count as electives for a public policy major or field concentration. A maximum of one three-credit independent study course (PLCY 395, 396, 496, 596, or 696) may be counted toward the elective for a public policy major or field concentration. For credit toward the major, an independent study proposal form must be completed by the student, approved by the student's independent study instructor, and submitted to the department's student services manager. **A maximum of one three-credit transfer or study abroad course, or two Washington Domestic and Foreign Policy Burch Field Seminars may be counted toward the elective for a public policy major or field concentration.**

Honors in Public Policy

An honors program is available to students who have demonstrated their ability to perform distinguished work. The honors program provides public policy majors the opportunity to pursue an independent research project over a two-semester period.

Students begin the program by taking PLCY 691H Honors Research Design for Public Policy in the spring semester of their junior year. Students who expect to study abroad in the spring semester of their junior year are strongly encouraged to complete PLCY 691H in the fall of their junior year. During this course students will complete their research proposals, obtain Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval for their research proposals, and complete the first two chapters of their proposed thesis. These chapters will describe the aims of the research, summarize its significance to the field, and critique the relevant literature.

If the research proposal is approved by the IRB and the first two chapters are approved by the thesis adviser, students continue their thesis research in the senior year under the direction of a faculty adviser in PLCY 692H. Upon successful completion of the written thesis and an oral examination of the thesis research, the student may graduate with honors or highest honors.

Core public policy courses include ECON 310 or 410, or PLCY 410; and PLCY 210, 220, 340, and 460. To be admitted to the honors program, students must have at least a 3.2 overall grade point average and 3.5 in core public policy courses, not including PLCY 210. They should also have completed at least four core courses in the public policy major, including the prerequisites for PLCY 692H (i.e., PLCY 460 and 691H). In addition, they should have a written recommendation from at least one faculty member in public policy agreeing to serve as their thesis adviser. Students interested in participating in the honors program should contact the department's director of undergraduate studies or the director of the department's honors program and submit an application form prior to registering for enrollment in PLCY 692H. Please see the department's Web site or student services manager for an application form.

The honors thesis provides a total of six credit hours toward the major.
