Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.8. **Additionally, students must earn a grade of B- or higher in BIOL 252/252L, PHYI 292 and MCRO 251.**

All lower-division courses must be completed before beginning nursing courses.

Admission to the School of Nursing is competitive. The minimum cumulative grade point average for admission to the B.S.N. option is a 2.8 on a 4.0 scale, and the minimum cumulative grade point average for the A.B.S.N. option is a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Effective with January 2012 matriculation (August 2011 application deadline), applicants must have completed the two-course combination, Anatomy and Physiology I and Anatomy and Physiology II sequence from the same college/university, OR a complete course in Anatomy and a complete course in Physiology. If these courses are not completed on this campus, they must be approved equivalents to the courses offered at UNC–Chapel Hill.
