Students who receive PL or BE credit for GERM 301 and/or GERM 302 must substitute this credit with coursework (3 credit hours each to replace GERM 301 and/or GERM 302) to complete major requirements. The additional coursework must be numbered above GERM 303. Students may not re-enroll in a course for which they have received PL or BE credit.
