- 2.0 OR HIGHER GPA REQUIRED IN MAJOR AND MINOR CORE COURSES. No more than 45 hours of SPAN courses, including SPAN 101-204, can count toward graduation.
*Completion of SPAN 261 or SPAN 267 is a prerequisite for the Hispanic linguistics major.
(\#) SPAN 360 should be taken as early as possible because it is a prerequisite for most other courses in the major.
(\#\#)Four additional courses from PORT 402; ROML 578; SPAN 375, 378, 397, 415, 417, 621, 676, 677, 678, 679, 680, 681, 682, 683, or 684. Two of which must be from the 500-level or above. Only one of PORT 402, SPAN 415, and SPAN 417 can be taken to satisfy this requirement of four additional courses. Prospective majors should complete the foreign language requirement by the end of their sophomore year. Students majoring in Hispanic linguistics may wish to complement the major with the Spanish minor in translation and interpreting.
No course can meet more than one requirement.
