Additional Requirements

- ECON 101 (social and behavioral sciences Approaches)
- At least 6 credit hours of approved Public Policy electives. Three credit hours may be for a 100- or 200-level PLCY course. The remaining three credit hours must be for an elective course at the 300 level or above. PLCY 130, 291, 293, 393, and 394 may not count as electives for the PLCY major.

Pre-Requisites/ Sequencing:

- ECON 101 is a prerequisite for PLCY 310 and ECON 410; the other prereq for ECON 410 is one of MATH 152, 231, STOR 112, or 113.
- PLCY 460 is a prerequisite for PLCY 698 and 691H, and a pre- or co-requisite for PLCY 581
- PLCY 581 is a pre- or co-requisite for PLCY 698 or 691H
- PLCY 691H is a prerequisite for PLCY 692H

Program Restrictions

PLCY 130, 291, 293, 393 and 394 may not count as electives for a public policy major or field. A maximum of one three-credit independent study course (PLCY 395, 396, 496, 596, or 696) may be counted toward the elective for a public policy major or policy field. A maximum of one three-credit transfer or study abroad course or two Honors Seminar on Public Policy and Global Affairs courses (PLCY 352H; PLCY 353H) may be counted as electives toward the public policy major. For credit toward the major, an independent study proposal form must be completed by the student, approved by the independent study instructor, submitted to the student services manager, and approved by the director of undergraduate studies before the internship begins.
