## Thrive Hub Advisors

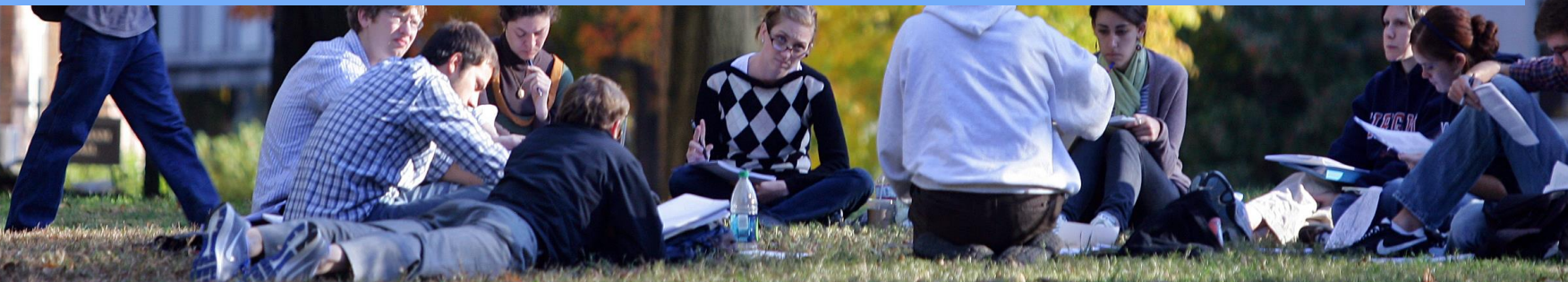
- Engage through appointments, directed communications, drop-ins
- Encourage exploration
- Clarify policies & procedures
- Connect to resources & opportunities

## Students

- Ask questions and make informed decisions
- Locate & access policies
- Seek & utilize resources regularly
- Connect with advising regularly

# Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

- Students own their educational records once they begin college coursework.
- Your student must give FERPA authorization for any staff to speak with you about academics.
- Students can provide authorization by creating a specific PIN in ConnectCarolina.



# Semester Course Load



- A first year course schedule will focus heavily on First-Year Foundations (IDEA's in Action Undergraduate Curriculum)
- 12-18 credit hours is full time status
- 15-17 credit hours is recommended
- A minimum of 120 credit hours are required for graduation
- 4 years = 8 semesters
- 15 hours x 8 semesters = 120 credit hours



# Class Registration

- Students are pre-registered for up to 2 First-Year Foundation courses
- Initial registration will take place during the months of July and August (specific date is related to your orientation session)
- Reserved seats for first-year students
- Some courses require placement scores and/or pre-requisites
- Students can edit their schedules from August 4 – 25th
